# What do they do?

- A nonprofit helping other nonprofits
- 63 developments in Orange County
  - Emergency, transitional and permanent
- Education, job skills training, physical & emotional support
- Mercy House



# Overview of Mercy House

- 56 beds & 5,000 people served so far
- Cubicle units with beds to keep privacy
- Washing machines and dryers
- Technology learning center with computers from Google
- Kitchen where staff cook hot meals

## Numbers:

- 1.2 Million dollar Budget
  - Vets and pets
  - Youth and families at risk
  - Foster kids in garden grove
- 24 Board members
- 8 Total staff

# Expected Outcomes

- Help transition more people into stability
- Be fully accounted for by the end of 2020
- Attempting to expand to maximum of 72 beds
  - 5-7 more families helped at a time



## \$1,000 towards:

- \$300: bedding & sheets
- \$150: cleaning supplies
- \$150: labor for beds
- \$400: maintenance cost of staff
